

CAN | CHRIS AKORDALITIS, PABLO BENZO, AMIR H. FALLAH, ALEKSANDAR TODOROVIC

Dio Horia Gallery is pleased to participate in the 2022 inaugural edition of Contemporary Art Now, with a group presentation of new works by Chris Akordalitis, Pablo Benzo, Amir H. Fallah and Aleksandar Todorovic, created especially for CAN Ibiza 2022.

Chris Akordalitis presents his latest larger-scale *You and Me* portrait, as well as the *Under the tree* series, including four smaller-size oil paintings on canvas, all revolving around the same, idyllic theme of togetherness and affection. The utopian frame of reference in Akordalitis' work, holding a strong grip on our collective imagination, embodies, in a way, a delightful form of escapism, seeking security in a fantasy world that is a genuine pleasure to get lost in, putting at the same time on central stage the artist's love for geometry. All-in-all we find ourselves running into some surprising versions of the yin-yang symbol, where the other is to the artist much more than just a transcendent ego; ergo, the individual sees the world through the other's eyes and then returns to its own center with new perspective and understanding.

Pablo Benzo's still life paintings A breath of universal delirium, Marios chair in Sagunto, Mesa con mantel y lámpara con duraznos and Pear and orange go a long way beyond the representation of mere objects. Somehow, these images look like echoing personalities, structuring compositions that may equally bring to mind landscapes or portraits, at a subconscious level. As feeling is a fundamental part of the process, we encounter an exemplary case of selective memory: here, evading confirmation bias or recalling information in a manner that confirms preexisting beliefs and hypotheses, the artist rather explores and conquests a wild land in the making, designing a proverbial map that results in a visual memoir, assembled by different dimensions of the subject-matter that push the creative journey to completion, establishing sentiment as the most important element of the picture.

Amir H. Fallah's *A letter to my countrymen* and *To exist and to live*, are highly political works, adhering to the artist's recurrent inquiries, following a lengthy & dexterous technique. These are also about rare cases where the artist, deftly integrating personal and collective narratives, draws away from a typical subversive practice of covering his subjects in drapery, so as not to be able to identify their physical features. Delivering a sharp comment on the war, calling the attention to all that contemporary man seems to find insignificant, Fallah's profound & poetic compositions reflect on how indifferent we are to the moral worth of our actions, reveling in the brazenness, uninterested in the consequences; hence, this very day, we keep indifferent to our conscience, indifferent to all our instincts, as our dystopian nightmares are coming true.

Politically engaged art by Aleksandar Todorovic appears to be a conceptually evolved critique on the political landscape, popular culture, and its many facets. As it happens, in his signature egg tempera on wooden board works *Stay Safe, Saint FFBF celebrity*



and *Dichotomy of Stereotypes*, the artist approaches the concept of evil from different angles, in an attempt to understand its origins and its ramifications, making use of politically incorrect humor, deceptively attractive colors and cartoon-like cheerfulness. In reverse, his latest *Circle of love* exits polarities and investigates a way out of the doom and gloom, where true connection emerges as a viable solution to the dystopia of our times: "If the world seems in trouble / Stop with the doomscrolling / Put your phone down and relax / Look me in the eyes my love / Time moves fast and life is short / This moment is all we have".

CAN, Contemporary Art Now, is a curated and invitation-only art fair, emphasizing on new contemporary languages, that takes place in the Mediterranean island of Ibiza. A meeting point for artists, art collectors, enthusiasts and international vips, CAN brings together over thirty galleries from Europe, America and Asia, presenting more than 100 artists at its venue, Ctra. D'Eivissa a Sant Antoni, on July 13 – 17, 2022.

- **Chris Akordalitis** (b.1989, Paphos, Cyprus) lives and works in Paphos. He received an MFA from Kunst academy in Düsseldorf, where he studied painting under Prof. Andreas Schulze and sculpture under the artist Tony Cragg.
